Dear MaineCare Member,

This letter is to tell you about an exciting option that you now can get under your MaineCare benefit. Effective immediately you can get your drugs through the mail. If you choose to use mail order you will not have to pay any co-pay.

You have been identified as using five or more medications monthly. The current co-pay per medicine is \$2.50. Using this voluntary option can save you up to \$25 per month on your prescriptions. If you choose this option, you will get a three-month supply of your medications through the mail each time you order.

Enclosed you will find an order envelope for I Care Pharmacy and an order form for Walmart Pharmacy. You can call I Care at 1-888-422-7319 or Walmart at ----- to ask for information on this cost savings option. If you are currently receiving prescriptions from a Nurse Practitioner, however, you can not use Walmart as your mail order pharmacy since their mail order operation is in Texas which prohibits the filling of Nurse Practitioner prescriptions without the signature of a physician.
